## ASEAN-KOREA MUSIC FESTIVAL (ROUND) 2025 SHOWCASES UNITY THROUGH CULTURAL EXCHANGE

**KUALA LUMPUR, 20 June 2025** — The ASEAN-Korea Music Festival (ROUND) 2025 was officially launched this evening by The Honourable Khairul Firdaus Akbar Khan, Deputy Minister of Tourism, Arts and Culture Malaysia, at Saloma, Kuala Lumpur. The opening ceremony gathered diplomats, cultural leaders, artists, and guests from across ASEAN and the Republic of Korea in a vibrant celebration of unity through music and culture. In line with the spirit of Malaysia MADANI, which champions inclusivity, sustainability and mutual respect, the festival reflects the country's vision of building a compassionate and culturally rich society through international collaboration.
