Allowed Movements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Subject to the countries approved by the Ministry of Health (MOH) / Immigration Department (JIM) / Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) (please refer to MOTAC's official website at https://motac.gov.my and JIM's official website at https://www.imi.gov.my/). • The list of high risk countries / prohibited countries refers to the tourists' presence and not citizenship. • Approval through the MyTravelPass (MTP) system during admission is NOT required. • Minimum 3-days stay in Langkawi Island. • The movement to and from Langkawi Island shall be by air transport either through Kuala Lumpur or directly to Langkawi Island. <p><u>Stay (4 – 6 days)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The movements of international tourists are limited to the district of Langkawi Island only. • Fully vaccinated tourists with booster may leave Langkawi Island on Day 5. <p><u>Stay (≥7 days)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fully vaccinated tourists may leave Langkawi Island through the domestic exits (air or sea) on Day 7 or Day 5 for tourists with booster. • Movement to all destinations in Malaysia is allowed except areas declared under the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO).



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Action	Brief Description
Tourist Category	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Individuals who have been completely vaccinated and have passed the period of 14 days from the second-dose injection or after 28 days of single-dose injection (depending on the type of vaccine). The vaccines approved by the MOH are as in Appendix 1. Individuals are considered boosted upon receiving the booster dose injection. • No age limit. Children aged 12 and below may travel with their vaccinated parents / guardian without having to prove their vaccination. The children’s age are based on calendar year. • The following individuals are not allowed to travel under the Langkawi Island International Travel Bubble: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Positive for COVID-19 infection; ✓ Close contact to positive cases; ✓ Individuals subject to a Home Surveillance Order (HSO); ✓ Individuals subject to mandatory quarantine;and ✓ Those who are symptomatic.



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Action	Brief Description
Screening Test	<p><u>PRE-DEPARTURE TO MALAYSIA</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every tourist must download and activate the MySejahtera application before departing to Malaysia. They are required to fill up the health declaration and pre-departure form that can be accessed through the TRAVELLER icon in the MySejahtera application. • The proof of details needs to be brought along or uploaded to the MySejahtera application for checking. • Every tourist (except children aged two (2) years and below) is required to take the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test two (2) days before departing for Langkawi Island. • Test results should be provided in printed or digital form, in English or Bahasa Melayu and should be shown to the authorities upon request.
Purchase of Tour / Travel Packages	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Every tourist must engage a tour operator/ travel agent in Malaysia that is registered and licensed with MOTAC or through a foreign representative who uses the services of a Malaysian tour operator / travel agent that is registered and licensed with MOTAC. • Free Independent Traveller (FIT) is NOT allowed. • The tour/ travel package offered must include: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. The particulars of tour operator/ travel agent registered and licensed under MOTAC (including license number) by referring to https://www.motac.gov.my/en/check/tobtab; ii. Round trip flight tickets (either purchased directly with the airline or through a tour operator/ travel agent). Exemption is given to Malaysian tourists living abroad; iii. Accommodation; iv. Booking / payment of compulsory COVID-19 screening tests; v. Tour guide (TG); and vi. Itinerary/ tour package (need to go through tour operator/ travel agent). <p><i>*FIT means travellers / tourists who plan vacation on their own.</i></p>



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Action	Brief Description
Purchase of Insurance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mandatory for every foreign tourist to purchase an insurance policy worth USD50,000 (COVID-19 and travel) for the duration of their stay in Malaysia. This insurance policy can be purchased from a Malaysian or foreign insurance company before departure to Malaysia and can be packaged into a tourist package by the tour operator / travel agent. • Insurance policies packaged together with the purchase of flight tickets by the airline or accommodation are also accepted / allowed as long as the coverage is for COVID-19 and travel, which includes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily quarantine facility expenses • Emergency medical transportation by air/ sea to the nearest private medical facility following a positive COVID-19 diagnosis (Categories 3 – 5) • Emergency medical expenses for treating illness or injury • Mortuary and burial services • Daily isolation facility expenses • Malaysian citizens living abroad are exempted from this requirement.
Hotel Booking	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It is compulsory for every foreign tourist to book their hotel before flying into Malaysia through the tour operator/ travel agent that is registered and licensed with MOTAC. • Printed proof of documentation such as payment receipt for the tour package need to be brought along.
Booking and payment for laboratory test	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Booking and payment for RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test need to be included in the tour package offered by the tour operator/ travel agent that is registered and licensed with MOTAC.



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Action	Brief Description
Screening Tests & Quarantine Exemption	<p>Flights via Kuala Lumpur</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Upon arrival at KLIA or klia2, tourists will be fitted with an identification tag by the operator of a private health screening test facility. The private health screening facility operator need to check: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the tourist's complete vaccination certificate; ensure MySejahtera Application has been downloaded and functioning in the tourist's electronic device; ensure that tourists scan the "Langkawi Island International Tourism Bubble Traveller" QR code and complete the MySejahtera Travel form. Thereafter, tourists need to undergo the RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test (RMT) COVID-19 at the private health screening facility. Children aged two (2) years and below DO NOT NEED to undergo the COVID-19 screening test. MOTAC staffs will examine the checklist for tour operators. Malaysian citizens returning from abroad are also allowed into Langkawi Island with the same procedure as foreign tourists. Tourists will be sent to the MOH counter / station to confirm / verify the results of the COVID-19 screening test as well as the confirmation of quarantine exemption. Only tourists with negative results and have obtained clearance from the MOH are allowed to proceed to the Immigration Department counter. If a tourist was found to be symptomatic or positive, the private health screening facility operator is responsible for arranging the transfer of the tourist to designated private isolation/ quarantine locations (for categories 1 & 2) or private hospitals (for categories 3,4 & 5).



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Action	Brief Description
Safety Inspection & Screening by the Immigration Department	<p><u>Flights via Kuala Lumpur</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Only tourists with negative results for the RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test COVID-19 conducted at KLIA or klia2 are allowed to continue proceed to the Immigration Department counter. • At the Immigration Department counter, tourists are required to submit the following documents during inspection: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> passport; visa (if necessary); round trip flight tickets (printed); and tour/ travel packages (printed).
Resuming the Journey to Langkawi Island via Domestic Flight	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourists who pass the security check and screening by the Immigration Department can proceed to the check-in counter to continue their journey via domestic flight to Langkawi Island from KLIA or klia2. • For tourists who have to stay overnight at KLIA or klia2 due to unavoidable reasons such as missed/cancelled domestic flight or domestic flight scheduled on the next day, they are allowed to stay at the Sama-Sama Express Hotel KLIA or the Sama-Sama Express Hotel klia2. • Tour operators must ensure that the transit period is at least 5-6 hours before the next flight. This is to provide sufficient time for screening tests and document examinations by the relevant authorities.



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Action	Brief Description
Resuming the Journey to Langkawi Island via Domestic Flights	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The luggage for tourists via KLIA or klia2 must be handled by check-in directly to the final destination of Langkawi Island for airlines that have a code-sharing agreement (codeshare) with Malaysia Airlines or by interline arrangement. The tour operator / travel agent must ensure that proper arrangements have been made with the airline on which the tourists are boarding for luggage collection arrangements at KLIA or klia2 if the flight is not a codeshare flight with Malaysia Airlines and does not have the required interline arrangements. Upon arrival in Langkawi Island, tourists can start the tour and do not have to take the COVID-19 screening test on the second day. For tourists entering through KLIA or klia2 who will stay in Langkawi Island not exceeding three (3) days or 72 hours, they do not need to undergo the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test before flying out of Malaysia. If the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test conducted at KLIA or klia2 has exceeded 72 hours, tourists must undergo the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test before departing from Langkawi to KLIA or klia2 for the next flight out from Malaysia, depending on the requirements of the next destination country.

Direct Flights to Langkawi Island

Health Inspection & Quarantine Exemption by the Ministry of Health

- Upon arrival at the Langkawi International Airport (LIA), tourists need to proceed to the MOH counter/ station at LIA for inspection and quarantine clearance. Tourists are required to submit the following documents:
 - Vaccination certificate;
 - RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test COVID-19 test results performed taken two (2) days before boarding the aircraft to Malaysia (printed or digital);
 - Proof of purchase of minimum insurance of USD50,000 (COVID-19 and travel); and
 - MySejahtera application has been downloaded and functioning in the tourist's electronic device.
- Scan the "Langkawi Island International Tourism Bubble Traveller" QR code and complete the MySejahtera Travel form.
- Tourists who have passed the health check and screening may proceed to the Immigration Department counter.

	<u>Direct Flights to Langkawi Island</u>
Safety Inspection and Screening by the Immigration Department	<p>At the Immigration Department counter, tourists are required to submit the following documents during inspection :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> passport; visa (if necessary); round trip tickets (printed); and tour/ travel packages (printed). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourists who pass the security check and screening by the Immigration Department are allowed to exit the LIA, meet the TG and proceed directly to the hotel. • The RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test COVID-19 is to be performed on the day of arrival or at the latest the second day at a private health screening facility that has been booked by the tour operator / travel agent and managed by the TG. While waiting for the screening test result, tourists are allowed to directly go to the hotel and will be issued a Home Surveillance Order (HSO) digitally through the MySejahtera application. • Children aged two (2) years and below DO NOT NEED to undergo the COVID-19 screening test. • If a tourist is found to be symptomatic or positive, the responsible tour operator / travel agent must report to the MOH / private health screening facility that has been appointed to manage the tourist to a designated private isolation / quarantine locations (for categories 1 & 2) or private hospitals (for categories 3,4 & 5). • If found negative, tourists can continue the tour.

Stay at Langkawi Island	<p><u>Stay (4 – 6 days)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The movement of the international tourists are limited to the district of Langkawi Island only until the Day 7. Fully vaccinated tourists with booster may leave Langkawi Island on Day 5 Tourists need to undergo the RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test COVID-19 before departing from Malaysia, depending on the health protocol of the next country of destination. Children aged two (2) years and below DO NOT NEED to undergo the COVID-19 screening test. If a tourist was found to be symptomatic or positive, the responsible tour operator / travel agent must report to the MOH / private health screening facility that has been appointed to manage the tourist to a designated private isolation/quarantine locations (for categories 1 & 2) or private hospitals (for categories 3,4 & 5).



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Action	Brief Description
Return trip from Malaysia via KLIA or klia2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For tourists entering through KLIA or klia2 who will stay in Langkawi Island not exceeding three (3) days or 72 hours, they do not need to undergo the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test before flying out of Malaysia. • If the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test conducted at KLIA or klia2 has exceeded 72 hours, tourists must undergo the RT-PCR COVID-19 / Rapid Molecular Test before departing from Langkawi to KLIA or klia2 for the next flight. • For tourists who have to stay overnight at KLIA or klia2 due to unavoidable reasons such as missed/cancelled domestic flight or domestic flight scheduled on the next day, they are allowed to stay at the Sama-Sama Express Hotel KLIA or the Sama-Sama Express Hotel klia2. • If both hotels are full, tourists will be allowed to stay in Hotel Sama-Sama with supervision from tour operators.



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Action	Brief Description
Stay at Langkawi Island	<p><u>Stay (≥7 days)</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fully vaccinated tourists may leave Langkawi Island through the domestic exits (air or sea) on Day 7 or Day 5 for tourists with booster. If a tourist was found to be symptomatic and if found positive, conduct a COVID-19 RTK Ag test and the responsible tour operator / travel agent must report to the MOH / private health screening facility that has been appointed to manage the tourist to a designated private isolation / quarantine locations (for categories 1 & 2) or private hospitals (for categories 3,4 & 5). Document inspection to confirm that tourists have been on Langkawi Island for a minimum of seven (7) days for fully vaccinated tourists or five (5) days for tourists with booster should be conducted by the authorities at the exit (air / sea).



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Action	Brief Description
Outside of Langkawi Island after the end of “LITB quarantine”	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourists who have fulfilled both of the stated conditions are allowed to travel to any destination within Malaysia except areas declared as under the Enhanced Movement Control Order (EMCO). • Tourists may choose whether to use a tour / travel package under the tour operator / travel agent registered and licensed with MOTAC or continue the holiday as Free Independent Traveller (FIT). • Tourists are not required to undergo the COVID-19 screening test before departing from Langkawi to other destinations in Malaysia. If symptomatic, tourists are advised to undergo COVID-19 screening test.
Screening Test	<p><u>DEPARTURE FOR HOME OUTSIDE OF MALAYSIA</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourists need to undergo the RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Testing before departing Malaysia, although it depends on the health protocol of the next country of destination. • If a tourist was found positive, the tourist will be sent to a designated private isolation / quarantine location (for categories 1 & 2) or a private hospital (for categories 3,4 & 5). • If the result is negative, tourists are allowed to leave Malaysia.



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Entrepreneur / Tourism Service Provider	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employees limit including operations and management are set at 100% capacity. • Only individuals including business operators, employees and tour agents with “Low Risk” status in the MySejahtera application will be allowed to work.
Vacation Types	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Vacation with a minimum of three (3) days. • Holidays with accommodation/ return ticket bookings made in advance with a tour operator/ travel agent registered and licensed under MOTAC until the 7th day only. • Tour / travel packages that have been booked through tour operators/ travel agents who are authorized, registered and licensed with MOTAC. • Accompanied by proof of printed documents such as payment receipts for tour/ travel packages.
Transportation Modes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Air transport through airlines that operate directly to Langkawi Island or through Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) or klia2. Flight arrivals via klia2 commences on 22 February 2022. • For tourists who intend to proceed to other destinations (on Day 7 for fully vaccinated tourists or on Day 5 for tourists with booster) they may choose sea or air transport through a recognised exit point to the next destination.



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Types of International Tourism Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourism activities in the Langkawi Island District only until the 7th day or 5th day for those with booster. • Accommodation in hotels and homestays including the facilities in the premises such as prayer room, swimming pool, gymnasium, lounge, hall, Business Events (MICE), tourism and cultural events subject to the general SOP of National Recovery Plan Phase 4 issued by the National Security Council and SOP of the related Ministries / Departments / Agencies. • The main tourist attraction products such as beach activities, water sports, snorkelling, scuba diving, fishing tourism, edutainment centre, recreation parks, extreme/ adventure/ nature parks, farms, aquariums, zoos, and other leisure, recreational and social activities. • Niche activities (golfing, scuba diving, cycling, angling, yatching, etc). • Eco-Adventure activities (bird watching, caving, mountain climbing, white-water rafting, hiking, jungle trekking, camping etc.). • Arts, culture, and heritage premises such as museums, libraries, art galleries, cultural heritage art centres/ villages, cultural performances etc. • Theme Parks and Family Entertainment Centres. • Academic tours such as Geopark Discovery Centre, Science Centre etc. • Spa operations, reflexology, massage centres and pedicure and manicure services.

Reopening of the International Tourism Sector for Langkawi Island Pilot Project Checklist	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Digital vaccination certificate or vaccination confirmation card recognized by MOH (in digital/ printed form). • Self-identification document / passport / visa (if necessary). • Information of tour operators / travel agents and itineraries of purchased packages. • Printed proof of purchased tour / travel package, which includes: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i. The particulars of tour operator / travel agent registered and licensed under MOTAC (including license number) by referring to https://www.motac.gov.my/en/check/tobtab; ii. Round trip flight tickets (either purchased directly with the airline or through a tour operator/ travel agent); iii. Accommodation; iv. Booking/ payment of compulsory COVID-19 screening tests; v. Tour guide (TG); and vi. Safety Responsibilities of International Tourists	<p>Before Travel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure a digital vaccination certificate or complete vaccination confirmation card is available (in printed form). Monitor their own health condition by ensuring that they are always at the low-risk status and updating it through the MySejahtera application from time to time. Make reservations through a tour operator/ travel agent registered and licenced under MOTAC. <p>During Travel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Monitor own self and the tourist group members' health conditions are at an optimum level, whereby it is non-symptomatic. It is mandatory to ensure that their MySejahtera profile is always at the low-risk status and to always check-in using the MySejahtera application at every stop/ destination. It is compulsory to wear face masks in public areas and vehicles. Comply with all travel instructions and related SOPs in force at every destination visited. Tourists are allowed to continue their journey to any destination in Malaysia (except to areas declared under EMCO) on Day 7 for fully vaccinated tourists or on Day 5 for tourists with booster.

Safety Responsibilities of International Tourists	<p>Before Returning to the Country of Origin:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tourists need to undergo the RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test before departing Malaysia, although it depends on the health protocol of the next country of destination. • For international tourists staying for three (3) days in Langkawi Island, the RT-PCR / Rapid Molecular Test on the day of arrival or at the latest on the second day is valid for boarding the aircraft (only applicable for tourists flying directly to Langkawi Island).

Security Responsibility by Tourism Operators / Tourism Service Providers	<p>Before Travel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Licensed tour companies that provide package services with tour guides and tour vehicles are required to submit supporting documents in bulk for their group of tourists. • Provide sickbay / special rooms for emergency isolation of unhealthy or symptomatic tourists, if necessary before the journey begins. • A valid tourist vehicle registered and licensed with MOTAC and the Ministry of Transport Malaysia (MOT) may travel by showing a vehicle permit/ Temporary Alteration License (LPS) if required. • Ensure that the vehicle sanitation process is periodic and complies with existing SOPs. • One (1) tour guide with a maximum of 20 people in the tour group to coordinate throughout the tour itinerary.

Action	Brief Description
Security Responsibility by Tourism Operators / Tourism Service Providers	<p>During Travel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensure that tourists fully follow the itinerary of the tour that has been set and constantly monitor the movement of tourists throughout the visit period under the responsibility of TG. • Ensure tourists check in the premises using the MySejahtera application or manually write the name and telephone number (if there is no internet coverage). • Ensure tourists always wear face masks at all times and comply with the existing SOPs. • Tour operators / travel agents / TG, need to check the places that will be visited by tourists are not categorized as at-risk or the presence of COVID-19 outbreak. • Check and ensure the tourist’s profile status of MySejahtera is low risk. • Check the whereabouts of tourists from time to time during the tour sessions either physically or digitally (mobile devices). • Ensure tourists undergo the COVID-19 screening tests that have been fixed by MOH.

Security Responsibility by Tourism Operators / Tourism Service Providers	<p>Service Providers / Premises Owners / Tourist Attraction Products:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Licensees and premises owners are required to provide the MySejahtera QR Code facility. • Hand sanitizer must be provided at the entrance and used before entering all premises. • The use of the MySejahtera application is mandatory in the area of wide internet access. • The use of customer attendance registration books is only allowed in areas where there is no internet coverage or due to other reasonable reasons (senior citizens, absence of smartphones etc.). • Licensees and premises owners must ensure that customers check in at the premises using the MySejahtera application or manually write down their names and telephone numbers if there is no internet coverage. • Avoid premises or high risk locations based on the ‘HOTSPOT’ in the MySejahtera application.

Security Responsibility by Tourism Operators / Tourism Service Providers	<p>During Travel:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Advise tourists to seek immediate treatment at the nearest private health screening facility if symptomatic. Ensure compliance with all travel instructions and SOPs in force at each destination visited. <p>Before Departure Back to Home Country (4 - 6 days) or to Other Destinations (≥ 7 days):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If a tourist is symptomatic, conduct a COVID-19 screening test and if found positive, the tourist will be sent to a designated private isolation/ quarantine location (for categories 1 & 2) or a private hospital (for categories 3,4 & 5). If found negative, tourists may continue their journey back to their country of origin or to other destinations in Malaysia.
